2024 CANADIAN UNIVERSITY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Ontario recently celebrated a momentous occasion as it proudly hosted the inaugural Canadian University Ski Championships at Craigleith Ski Club and Georgian Peaks on February 21st and 22nd. This groundbreaking event marked the first time that Canada's university ski teams gathered from all corners of the country to compete.

Six universities were represented at the Canadian Championships Lakehead University, University of Ottawa, Dalhousie, University of Montreal, University of Laval, and the University of Calgary. The FIS race format added an extra layer of excitement, with both individual and team scores being awarded in the University Category, intensifying the competitive spirit among participants.

Congratulations to the University of Calgary Dino's who walked away as the 2024 team champions.

The Women's team title was secured by the University of Laval Rouge et Or, and the Men's title to the Dino's.

The women's individual slalom title was won by Cléa Peter from les Carabins, and the giant slalom by Alyssa Bergeron-Saucier also of the Carabins.




