## MAC MARCOUX BIDS FAREWELL AFTER AN INSPIRING AND IMPRESSIVE CAREER

Last Wednesday marked a bittersweet moment for the world of Paralympic alpine skiing as Mac Marcoux, the 26-year-old sensation from Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, officially announced his retirement. Over the years, Marcoux etched his name in Canadian sporting history, having won six Paralympic medals, including three gold, and five world titles in the visually impaired classification of alpine skiing. He finished his career with 52 World Cup podiums.

As a visually impaired athlete, Marcoux navigated the slopes with the guidance of accomplished guides, including his brother Billie Joe, Robin Remy, Jack Leitch, and Tristan Rodgers. The pinnacle of Marcoux's career saw him claim gold in four out of five races at the 2017 World Championship. In the 2019-20 season, he demonstrated unparalleled dominance by securing victory in all eight World Cup races he entered.

Throughout his career, Marcoux exhibited extraordinary resilience as he dealt with

despite contending with the challenges of knee surgery and a back injury.

Mac's passion for speed and skiing have also taken him to the backcountry where he aims to educate outdoor companies and guides on accessibility for the visually impaired, for people using sit skis, and for people with other disabilities.

## ONTARIO MASTERS @ 2024 WORLD WINTER MASTERS GAMES

Ontario Masters were well represented with 19 athletes, of the 34 Canadians, that attended the 2024 WWMG in Lombardy, Italy. Ponte di Legno (translation "Wooden Bridge" or as I liked to refer to it as "Woodbridge") is a pretty village that was established in 1729; this is where Canada House (Hotel Mignon) was located and where many Canadians stayed.

The Alpine races were split between two venues being Ponte di Legno (PDL) for the giant slalom and slalom races, and Aprica (45-minute bus ride away) for the Super-G races. PDL skiing was exceptional in that it offers lots of piste skiing with 3000 metres elevation, many runs, and chairlifts to move skiers around. The snow conditions in PDL were very good with two racecourses: one for the Men's A and another for the Men's B & Women's C. The SG course was very good, and it was almost a straight course with no major directional changes or mid-course steep pitches, with blind gates, and the end of the course was almost flat for a tuck finish. Unfortunately, the Super-G race was cancelled for Men's B.

Ontario Masters brought home one gold (Mike Robbins) and two silvers (Mike Robbins & Tiana Koffler-Boyman) and many were in the top 10 rankings. **Full results** available here.

Overall, the 2024 WWMG was a wonderful experience. PDL is beautiful, the weather was almost perfect, and the village is small enough to walk from Canada House to the ski lifts and gondola for the GS and SL races, and to the stage where medals were awarded to the athletes

# **AOA STRATEGIC PLAN SPOTLIGHT**

## **U16 - National Competition Strategy and Benchmarking**

Over the summer of 2023 Alpine Canada along with the PSO's completed a U16 national championship review and developed a new strategy for competition structure and national benchmarking at U16.

The process involved sending surveys to all PSOs to gather feedback on the perceived relevance of the U16 National Championships and to explore alternative competition structures for this age group. As a result of the findings, ACA has decided to change the championship structure for U16s, starting in 2024.

The new championship structure will transition to an ACA Eastern and Western Regional Championship. The primary rationale for change in championship structure

The core event elements will remain consistent both in the east and the west. Events to include SL/GS/SG/ + ACA national skills combine, with optional events including team parallel and/or ski cross. Eastern and Western regionals should ideally occur within a 2-week window, considering school breaks. All events should conclude by the end of March to finalize logistics for the Whistler Cup.

To continue enabling ACA and PSOs to conduct national benchmarking at the U16 level, ACA has chosen to use the Whistler Cup as the national/international benchmark for this age group. ACA will field 2 Team Canada teams at the Whistler Cup for the Nations top U16's. Selection criteria will equally consider Eastern and Western Regional U16 Championships and will be made available shortly on the ACA criteria and publications page. AOA will also field two teams for the Whistler cup. Selection criteria for Whistler Cup Team Ontario can be found within AOA's Provincial Competition Rules document available here.

Alpine Ontario is excited to host the Eastern Regional Championships from March 20th to 24th at Osler Bluff and Georgian Peaks. Qualification for the 60 Ontario quota spots (30 M, 30 W) will be determined from the results of the U16 OCUP Finals in NCD.


