## **MACKENZIE U14 OCUP FINALS - CRAIGLEITH & ALPINE**

What an exciting week of racing at the Mackenzie Investments U14 OCUP Finals hosted by Alpine Ski Club and the Craigleith Ski Club. Athletes raced in 2 slalom events, a giant slalom, and a dual slalom. Despite early concerns about having enough snow to host the events, the two clubs, their race crews with a helping hand from volunteers did a fabulous job in creating excellent race surfaces for our athletes to showcase their hard work and skills. Thank you!

The U14 OCUP Finals brings together our province's best 12 and 13-year old children. Ski racers in the *Train to Train* phase of Alpine Canada's Long Term Athlete Development strategy are focused on transferring fundamental technique and basic tactical skills into the competitive environment. The goal is applying what they've learned in training and not on winning at all costs .

From this event, the fastest 15 boys and 15 girls were selected to represent Ontario at the CanAm race series in Sugarloaf, Maine on March 28-31st.

## U16 EASTERN REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Alpine Ontario Alpin (AOA) would like to congratulate the 60 alpine ski racers who competed as part of Team Ontario at the Eastern Regional Championships that took place at Mont Saint Anne March 20-24. Ontario's racers and 15 coaches from around the province were led by Heather Metzger and Thomas Trusler to compete in a Slalom, Giant Slalom, Super G and an Alpine Canada Skills Combine against the best in from Quebec and the Maritimes. The Eastern Regionals are part of Alpine Canada's new format that splits the National Championships into an eastern and a western championship, and selects the fastest racers from each to attend Whistler Cup as the national benchmark.

Over the 4 days of competition, Ontario athletes took home 2 podium finishes. Congratulations to Glacier's **Kezik MAGILL** on his 3rd place in the GS, and **Liam LOSTY** of Craigleith for his 3rd place in the Slalom. A full list of results can be found here.



## **ONTARIO SKI TEAM UPDATE - NATIONAL'S SUCCESS**

The Ontario ski team have had a busy week on the road in Red Mountain at Canadian Senior National Championships and Alberta / BC spring series. Gabby Wall was third in the U21 Canadian National Champs GS and Elli Clark has hit the podium in 3rd place in the western spring series.

On the men's side, Kyle Blandford locked in a Senior National Champs Bronze in the GS, and Jayden Buckrell took top of the podium in the Slalom at Western Springs. The team will be moving on to Kimberly and Panorama for Nor-Am Finals before rounding off the season for camp at Sun Peaks.



**COACH TRAINING - SPRING UPDATE** 

Canada in organizing and running the Skills Combine where we evaluated the skiing skills of the U16 athletes who qualified for this event. All athletes were put through a battery of five basic skills on the first day of this event. Coaches who were attending the event were trained and organized to help with these skill evaluations, and future skills combines across Canada.

### Development Level coaching course - Georgian Peaks & Craigleith:

Eleven development level candidates participated in the DL course at Georgian Peaks and Craigleith. This course focuses on giving coaches more tools to use when coaching at the U12, U14 & U16 levels. Also helping to improve their course-setting abilities to develop better technical and tactical skills with their athletes.

#### Training Coach - Evaluators & evaluating coaches - Alpine Ski Club:

Building capacity – AOA worked to mentor a new Coach Evaluator at Alpine Ski Club to help Alpine certify more of their Entry-level coaches. This process helps build a stronger system in Ontario to allow more opportunities for young coaches to improve their coaching skills and progress through the coaching pathway.

#### Coach Up sessions - Devil's Glen:

This winter, AOA matched 4 coaches with the Ontario Women's Ski Team during two separate training days. Jacques Reid says "Helping to facilitate the interaction between these coaches and Cam Stephen was very rewarding. A big thanks to Cam for sharing his time to help these coaches with their personal development and to the athletes for being very inclusive with these coaches."

#### Development Level coach evaluation & coaching session - Battawa Ski Racing Club

Jacques Reid reports "I had a very rewarding day at Battawa Ski Hill in February where I was able to spend the morning with a coach looking to complete his DL certification by doing a "In training evaluation" of this coach will they worked with their athletes. During lunch time all Battawa coaches gathered for a brief presentation on coaching pathways and the role of Alpine Ontario as the provider for the education and training of coaches across the Province. The afternoon was spent on the hill and helping coaches run an athlete training session where we mainly worked on training their "Coaching eye". "



## **COACH EDUCATION 2023-24 SEASON!**

Another successful season of delivering Entry and Development Level Coach Courses all over Ontario. Proud to say we have 320 new Entry Level Trained coaches and 25 new Development Level Trained coaches to support our ski racing programs in Ontario.

We are offering one final course of the season, <u>Performance Level Coaching course at Mont Ste Anne QC April 8-12 registration details HERE.</u> One of the highlights of the season was the return of the Entry Level Coaching Course to 3 days on snow (previously two). This gave participants more time on snow for skiing and coaching development.

## 6. Spirit of Sandy Proctor Award

Embracing the characteristics in honour of Sandy Proctor, who for many years was the face of the Nancy Greene Ski League in Southern Ontario and had an enormous love for both the participants of this sport and the entire sport. This award recognizes the extraordinary contributions of one or more individuals to the "Spirit of Ontario Ski Racing". This person(s) is always wearing a smile and is a positive and motivating force to the people around him or her. This award recognizes the important role of motivators as they support the spirit of sport with their children, team, club, Division or Province.

### 7. Builder of the Year



HENRY - My shovel!


