






2018-2019 PROGRAM UNIVERSITY SKI TEAM





About the team

The University Ski Team is officially launching its 2018-2019 season program. Students enrolled at Carleton University, at the Université du Québec en Outaouais, and at the University of Ottawa have the opportunity to train with a group of highly skilled student-athletes and coaches, to compete on the FIS University Circuit, and to represent their respective academic institutions in the hunt for the RSEQ banners! The team's mission is to promote academic success through the development of skilled, fit and exemplary student-athletes. We envision the program as a stage for our athletes to shine, and to show that they are amongst the most driven and ambitious students in the region, throughout Canada, and on the world stage.

Eligibility requirements

To appear on the schools 2018-2019 rosters, students must respect all the requirements listed bellow:

- 1. A confirmation of enrolment into one of the following academic institutions:
 - Carleton University (Carleton Ravens);
 - Université du Québec en Outaouais or CÉGEP (UQO Torrens);
 - University of Ottawa (uOttawa Gee-Gees).
- 2. A letter of recommendation from a coach, and a short letter (300 words) of motivation describing your athletic and academic experience and aspirations;
- 3. (Highly recommended) Two years of previous ski racing experience at the FIS level.

Patrick Biggs – technical advisor (CSCF III & former CAST member)



In May 2004, Patrick was first named to represent Canada as a member of the Canadian Ski Team. He has competed in two Olympics, placed in the top 10 at two World Championships, scored top 30 results on the world cup for 7 years, stood on top of the podium 4 times at the Europa Cup and 4 times at the North American Cup. Patrick skied for Dartmouth University in New Hampshire while completing his engineering and studio artstudies.

Now acting as the Program Director for the Camp Fortune Ski Club, Patrick will be invited to some of the team's Tuesday night trainings so he can share his expertise and experience with the athletes.
