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# PROVINCIAL COMPETITION RULES

Competitions follow the rules issued by the governing bodies of alpine ski racing in Ontario: Alpine Ontario Alpin (AOA), Alpine Canada Alpin (ACA), and the International Ski and Snowboard Federation (FIS). These rules apply during the current season from July 1 to June 30.

AOA issues these Provincial Competition Rules (PCR ON) and Precisions for competitions in Ontario under AOA sanction. These provincial rules and precisions:

- **clarify** the national/international rules, by adding more descriptive information to an existing national/international rule
- **modify** the national/international rules, by adjusting a national/international rule for provincial competitions
- add to the national and international rules, by adding a provincial rule that does not exist in the national/international rules

# 1.1. Eligibility

Athletes register with AOA and pay the annual registration fee online via AOA SnowReg.

U14 and U16 OCup athletes are to complete a Fitness Test between **September 1**<sup>st</sup> and **December 31**<sup>st</sup>, and send results to Duncan Gibson-Maclean, <u>duncan@alpineontario.ca</u> by **December 31**<sup>st</sup>. See ACA Fitness Combine.

# 1.2. Prizes

219-ON **U16 U14** Rank 1-3 receive medals on the podium, rank 4-10 are recognized on stage.

**U12 U10** Rank 1-10 are recognized on stage.

All competitors and coaches should attend the prize-giving.

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608.1-ON U16 and U14 provincial finals are to be approved by AOA and published in the AOA Calendar.

608.2-ON Technical Delegates are proposed by the Ontario Officials Committee.

608.4-ON **Quota regulations** 

608.4.1-ON See *Table 2 Provincial Finals Quota*. Any unused quota goes to the division hosting the provincial finals. Any further unused quota will be assigned by AOA.

608.4.2-ON Under normal circumstances, the max. number of competing athletes must not exceed 160.

608.5.4-ON The divisional team captains are responsible for the identification of participants.

608.5.5-ON The starting order of the competitors is determined by drawing all competitors in one group before the first race of the series.

608.5.5.1-ON For the U16 5-race series, this order will be divided into 5 groups, referred to as groups A B C D E. Each group will be further divided into 4 subgroups, referred to as subgroups 1 2 3 4. The start order will be:

- 608.5.6-ON **Start order 2nd runs** In competitions with two runs, the starting order for the second run is the reverse order of the 1<sup>st</sup> run start order, including competitors with a 1<sup>st</sup> run DSQ or DNF.
- 608.6.1-ON **Provincial finals** may include Slalom, Giant Slalom, Super-G, Parallel, or team competition (e.g., Mixed Team Parallel).
- 608.6.1.1-ON For U16 provincial finals, the 5-race series will include: SG, 2 x GS, 2 x SL.
- 608.6.1.2-ON For U14 provincial finals, the 4-race series will include: SG, GS, SL, PAR.
- 608.10-ON **Overall Provincial Champion** Points are assigned to athletes based on their results at provincial finals (see *Table 18 WC 500 Points*). The athlete with the most points is the Overall Provincial Champion. In case of a tie, there will be multiple Overall Provincial Champions.



# 1.5. Group Draw and Start Order

- 621.3-ON **U16 & U14** The starting order of the competitors is determined by drawing all competitors in one group.
- 621.3.1-ON **OCup U16 Series & OCup U14 Series** The starting order of the competitors for the SL series, GS series and the SG series is determined before the first race of the series.
- 621.3.1.1-ON For the OCup U16 SL, GS and SG series, each divisional group will be drawn in one group which will be divided into 4 subgroups, referred to as groups A B C D. Each subgroup will be further divided into 4 smaller groups, referred to as groups A1 to D4. The starting order of A1 competitors, from all divisions, is determined by drawing all A1 competitors in one group. All groups from A1 to D4 will be similarly drawn. This is referred to as the initial draw.

Athletes who are added to the race series after the initial draw will be added sequentially to D4, D3, D2, ... A1. If more than 16 athletes are added, the 17<sup>th</sup> athlete will be added to D4, etc.

If there are more than 4 races in the series, the 5<sup>th</sup> race will return to the start order for race 1, etc. The start order for the races in the series will be:

621.3.1.2-ON For the OCup U14 SL, GS and SG series, each divisional group will be drawn in one group which will be divided into 3 subgroups, referred to as groups A B C. Each subgroup will be further divided into 3 smaller groups, referred to as groups A1 to C3. The starting order of A1 competitors, from all divisions, is determined by drawing all A1 competitors in one group. All groups from A1 to C3 will be similarly drawn. This is referred to as the initial draw.

Athletes who are added to the race series after the initial draw will be added sequentially to C3, C2, C1, ... A1. If more than 9 athletes are added, the 10<sup>th</sup> athlete will be added to C3, etc.

If there are more than 3 races in the series, the 4<sup>th</sup> race will return to the start order for race 1, etc. The start order for the races in the series will be:

621.3.2-ON **Starting Order at Provincial Championships** As an alternative to 621.3-ON for provincial championships, the Jury will draw start numbers as per 608.5.5-ON.



621.6-ON	<b>The draw</b> should take place on the day before the race. For night races, the draw
	must take place at the latest before noon on the race day.
621.8-ON	The draw should be held in a Team Captains' Meeting.

### **U16 U14 Starting Order for the 2nd Run** 621.11-ON

621.11.1-ON In competitions with two runs, the starting order for the second run is the reverse order of the 1st run start order, including competitors with a 1st run DSQ or DNF.

# 1.6. Course Setting

### 614.1.2.6-ON Course Setting

If multiple age categories are competing in the same course, course setting should be based on the specifications for one category older than the youngest category e.g., in a course set for U10, U12 and U14 racers, use U12 specifications. Maximum vertical drop for the youngest category should be respected.

- SL Gates A gate must have a minimum width of 4 m and a maximum of 6 m. The distance from turning pole to turning pole of successive gates must be between 7 m and 11 m for U16 U14 competitions. The distance between gates within combinations (hairpin or vertical) must be not less than 0.75 m and not more than 1 m. The gates in hairpin or vertical combinations must be set in a straight line. Delayed gates must have a minimum distance of 12 m and a maximum distance of 15 m from turning pole to turning pole for U16-U14 competitions. The distance between the gates within a delayed combination must be not less than 0.75 m from either turning pole.
- 801.2.4 **SL Number of Direction Changes** (number of direction changes by rounding up or down of the decimals) for U16 U14 competitions: 32% to 38% +/- 3 direction changes

# 803.2.1-ON SL Number of Gate Combinations

- U16: minimum 2 and maximum 4 hairpin combinations and minimum 1 and maximum 3 vertical combinations consisting of 3 maximum 4 gates.
- It must also contain a minimum of one and a maximum of three delayed turns
- U14: minimum 2 and maximum 4 hairpin combinations and minimum 1 and maximum 2 vertical combination consisting of maximum 3 gates.
- It must also contain a minimum of one and a maximum of three delayed turns
- 901.2.3 **GS Gates** The gates must be at least 4 m and at most 8 m wide. The distance between the nearest turning poles of two successive gates must not be less than 10 m. In U16-U14 competition the distance between turning pole and turning pole must be not more than 27 m.
- 901.2.4 **GS Number of Direction Changes** The Giant Slalom has to be set as follows (number of direction changes by rounding up or down of the decimals): U16-U14: 13% 18% of the vertical drop
- *The Super-G* must be set as follows: (number of direction changes by rounding up or down of the decimals)

The distance between the turning poles of two successive gates must be at least 25 m (exception: art. 1003.1.1 It is recommended to set the gates to make the best use of the terrain; Gate combinations according to art. 803.3 are allowed only in small numbers. The distance between the successive turning poles can in this case be less than 25 m, but must be at least 15 m.).

U16-U14 competitions: minimum 8%, maximum 12% direction changes of the vertical drop.



# 1.7. Parallel

- 1229-ON **Timing** For Qualification, the individual run times are measured from start to finish. For Elimination Heats, the difference in time is measured at the finish.
- 1230.1.1-ON **Qualification**: All Parallels must have a qualification for all eligible competitors. The starting order for the Qualification shall be determined by drawing all competitors in one group. The fastest 8 competitors from the qualification will advance to the first round (round of 8) of the Elimination Heats. In case of a tie for the 8th position, the competitor with the higher bib number qualifies.
- 1230.4-ON **Quarter-finals Elimination Heats**
- 1230.4.2-ON The losing four competitors are ranked according to time from the Qualification. (5th 8th)



3.6.4 Alteration/modification/additional element The helmets shall be used without alteration/modification, as certified by the manufacturer. Furthermore, no additional element/equipment shall be affixed on the surface of the helmet.



2.3.	Other Equipment
3.4-ON	Competition Suits are prohibited for U10.
3.5.1.1	<b>Definition</b> The back protector is an additional item of equipment, which protects the athlete's back against weather and external forces.
3.5.1.2	Specifications The back protector must adapt to the anatomical bend of the athlete's spine and lie flat against the body. The top edge of the back protector must be situated in the area of the spinal column and may not go above the 7th cervical vertebrae (C7). The maximum thickness must be in the middle part and may not exceed 45 mm; the thickness reduces at the edges of the back protector. Designs with the alter to improve aerodynamic properties are forbidden. The back protector must be worn underneath the competition suit.
3.5.1.3	Recommendation for specifications for children Children under 12 years, U14 and U16 should use back protectors.
3.6.6-ON	No chin guards on helmets for SG and GS.
3.6.7-ON	No hand guards on poles for SG and GS.
3.6.8-ON	Mouth guards are recommended.

4.3.1-ON	Length of upright pole above surface of snow max. 60"
4.3.2-ON	Diameter of upright pole max. 27 mm
