
WHISTLER CUP AS AN AOA BENCHMARK



SKI CROSS INTEGRATION



ONTARIO COACHES 2025 – 803 – great effort by clubs to ensure licensed status by Jan 31!

Entry Level Courses – slight decrease in registrations from previous year, hoping to boost some interest with instructors and keep growing the pool of new coaches for clubs' next season

- 258 (Down From 320) SQA 255 (74 in April courses)
- 28 Courses
- 22 Hosting Club
- 35 Learning Facilitators (12 Women)
- Delivered in Thunder Bay (thanks Chris Wiwchar) and Timmins (thanks Adam Wilcox)

Development Level Courses – the word is spreading about this great course, and we had 50% more participation this season

Accreditation Required – for all AOA sanctioned events the following will be included in Race Notices and coaches may be required to show proof of licensed status at events

Coach Requirements -

Coaches must:

- have a current coach membership with ACA-CSC (Canada Ski Coaches) in snowreg

- be a licensed ACA-CSC coach in snowreg as of Jan 31 of current season

- be present with athletes on-site

• - be able to show proof of up-to-date snowreg/NCCP/ official's requirements for the level of athlete participation to gain access to the training/racing environment (field of play). Coaches can download their ACA-CSC membership card into their apple wallet or google wallet on their phone.

• It is the club's and coach's responsibility to ensure they have the correct certifications and coaching license for competition.

- How did you challenge athletes and enforce standards?










U16 EASTERN'S MALES










